The American Hungarian Educators Association (AHEA) will hold its 39<sup>th</sup> Annual Conference from 8 May through 10 May 2014 at the University of Florida, Gainesville. We welcome participation by academic scholars, independent scholars, other educators, and graduate students who are devoted to the teaching, research, and dissemination of Hungarian culture, history, folklore, literature, language, fine arts, and music. Presenters must be or become members of AHEA to have their names appear on the program.

The Program Committee invites proposals for papers, focusing on the presenters' individual research and findings, connected with this year's theme:

### *Turning Points in Hungarian Life and History*

Proposals should consist of an abstract of 200- 250 words; a brief scholarly biography, including degrees and scholarly fields (50-100 words); a description of any audio-visual requirements; and full contact information. Proposals must be submitted online at <http://ahea.net/conferences/2014/submit-paper>, no later than **31 January 2014**.

**Program Committee Chairs** as listed below, will review for acceptance. Only one, electronic submission per author will be considered. Individual paper presentations are limited to no more than twenty minutes to allow for ten minutes of discussion following the presentation. The primary language of the conference is English; some sessions may be conducted in Hungarian, depending on the agreement of the session attendees.
