She is an experienced performer with orchestras both as a soloist and collaborator. She had several solo and chamber recitals in the U.S. and in Europe and had performances broadcast on Romanian National Radio.

Currently she is a doctoral student in Piano Performance at West Virginia University, studying with Peter Amstutz.
