The American Hungarian Educators Association (AHEA) will hold its 43rd Annual Conference from April 12 through April 14, 2018 at Cleveland State University in Cleveland, OH. We welcome participation by academics, independent scholars, other educators, and graduate students who are devoted to the teaching, research, and dissemination of Hungarian culture, history, folklore, literature, language, fine arts, and music. Presenters must be or become members of AHEA.

The Program Committee invites proposals for papers focusing on the presenters' individual research and findings connected with this year's theme:

Forging the Future, Facing the Past: Hungary and its Diaspora

As in past years, we look for proposals in any discipline in the humanities, social sciences, and arts, including those that might address themes from a cross-disciplinary perspective and thus bring fresh or enriched insights.

Proposals should consist of an abstract of 200-250 words; a brief scholarly biography, including degrees and scholarly fields (50-100 words) and full contact information. Proposals must be submitted online at <http://ahea.net/conferences/2018/submit-paper>, no later than **January 15, 2018**. Program Committee Chairs as listed below, will review them for acceptance. Only one (electronic) submission per author will be considered. Individual paper presentations are limited to twenty minutes and allow for ten minutes of discussion following the presentation. The primary language of the conference is English; some sessions may be conducted in Hungarian, depending on agreement by the session attendees.
